


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GREETINGS:

The UK's largest festival of live horror performance is proud to return for its 9th year, expanding over 2 venues and 3 theatre spaces, with help from our sponsors Horror Channel and PS Publishing. This year's festival has slithered its way through Islington to join forces with The Pleasance, presenting over 30 shows to rattle your bones and send shivers down your spine. Once again, the suitably spooky Old Red Lion Theatre will play host with 2 brand-new full-length productions seeing us through Halloween.

We are honoured to have playwright David Pinner, the author of RITUAL (the novel that inspired the classic cult movie THE WICKER MAN present the world premiere of his play Edred, The Vampyre at the Old Red Lion from the 28th October - 2nd November: casting a gothic shadow over the theatre with his soon-to-be modern horror classic. Between the 8th - 26th October the Old Red Lion will be re-united with former (deceased) residents via The Knock Knock Club's docu-play Last Orders. A blending of fact and fear, the Knock Knock Club have created a show based on the haunted folklore of the 600 year old pub and the paranormal investigations they have conducted throughout the building over the past few months. Both productions are bound to terrify, entertain and keep you checking under the bed before you go to sleep at night!

We will have our usual eclectic programme of shows by new and established horror companies taking over The Pleasance's Main House and Stage Space between 8th – 25th October. Festival Patron Nicholas Vince, Chatterer in Clive Barker's Hellraiser and Kinski in Nightbreed, brings his first one-man show to the stage in I AM MONSTERS!, an autobiographical exploration of monsters and what it means to be

an actor in the genre. *The Milkman Cometh* by **DeadPlant Theatre** aims to sour your semi-skimmed hopes and dreams with its grotesque horror comedy tale of demonic milk-deliverers, accompanied by a live metal band. More horror comedy appears in the form of multi-award winning **Casual Violence's** 10th Anniversary extravaganza (and final ever show) **Hang The Suits** as they bring us the best of their deranged sketches in this double-bill event.

Horror Cabaret is also in full swing this year with Nevermore Theatre's Serial Killer Cabaret, The Bitten Peach's Not Another Asian Horror and Pophorror's drag slasher panto He's Behind You! bringing some showbiz glam to the genre!

Those looking for genuine terror will find solace with **ONEOHONE Theatre Co.**'s interactive horror *CULT* infiltrating the festival, alongside festival favourites **House of Macabre** with their new shocker *What The Dolls Saw,* critically-acclaimed **Hermetic Arts'** uncanny *ANTHOLOGY*, and **Chamber Piece Theatre's** compendium of frightening tales *Late Night Horror.*

We are also working to increase representation and support for LGBTQIA+ writers within the genre through our annual playwriting competition focusing entirely on Queer Horror Writers; with the winner being unveiled to the public on the 25th October.

Don't miss your chance to join the festivities and celebrate the blood-curdling joy of live horror with fellow theatre-goers this Halloween season!

We live in a time of monsters. Zombies, fifteen seasons of Supernatural (what Sam and Dean have gone through), a teenage witch and her Satanic Lord, sparkly vampires, penny dreadfuls and even stranger things; such as Brexiters, Remoaners, migrants, Tory fascists, Lefty Labour Liberals. Pinkwashers, transphobic feminists, climate change deniers, climate change believers. Gays, Fascist Gays... pick a label, any label for your 'them', for your fear, for your monster.

And there's no need to march with pitchforks and flaming torches to hunt your monster. You just need a phone and a hashtag to become part of the baving mob.

The first monsters I encountered were in The Golden Treasury of Myths and Legends by Anne Terry White, beautifully illustrated by Anne and Martin Provensen, which I read aged around about eight years. It contains stories of a bull headed man, a snake haired woman whose gaze turned people to stone and the revenge seeking mother of a slain monster. I think there are a few heroes in there too. But I was always more interested in the monsters.

As a teenager I assembled and painted the Aurora 'Frightening Lightening', glow in the dark, plastic kits of Wolfman, The Phantom of the Opera and Dracula. Watching the late night screenings of the Roger Corman, Edgar Allan Poe films I became a huge fan of Vincent Price, whose monsters were so human. The books I read by torchlight under the bedclothes were the Peter Haining anthologies of horror stories along with novels by Stephen King and Dennis Wheatley.

No wonder I ended up playing monsters in Clive Barker films and am so honoured to be the Patron of the London Horror Festival, which this year has grown to cover two venues.

My deepest gratitude to Katy Danbury and Joe Willis, our festival producers, to the thirty companies from the UK, Ireland and Italy who've no doubt sweated blood to create the monsters of many forms you'll see on stage.

And my thanks to you our audience. Without you to watch our monsters, there would be no screams in the dark.

And what's a monster without screams?

A NOTE FROM DANSE MACABRE PRODUCTIONS

Before the Marvel Cinematic Universe, before Captain America, Iron Man and the like, there were the Universal Monsters, Dracula, The Wolf Man, The Mummy; classic horror creatures re-interpreted and released in solo films throughout the 1930s, before coming together in various mash-ups and integrated universe tie-in films.

And the iewel in the crown of this series: Frankenstein. This vivid reimagining of Mary Shelley's classic along with its beautiful gothic seguel Bride of the Frankenstein were beloved, becoming instant box office hits and influencing creatives for years and years to come; Guillermo Del Toro recently described it as his favourite movie of all time. It also made horror profitable and influential again after a slump in its popularity, proliferating the genre in the public consciousness and arguably keeping it there for the next 80 years.

So, who do we thank for these masterpieces of horror (apart from the incredible Mary Shelley, of course)? The answer is James Whale, an openly gay theatre and film director from Dudley, England. His mastery of the gothic and work on other horror properties such as The Invisible Man and The Old Dark House helped define the genre in popular culture during its visual arts infancy. And he is not the only queer creative who helped redefine the genre over the years.

In the 1980s, Clive Barker's Books of Blood, created a new sense of visceral terror utilising fantastical elements and contemporary settings to bring horror to urban cities, long before it became the norm in horror. His filmic works: Hellraiser, Nightbreed and Candyman - based off his short story The Forbidden - have been incredibly influential, with the characters of Pinhead and Kinski instantly recognisable wherever you go.

At the same time Barker rose to prominence, a possessed evil doll was also tearing up the screens; created by another influential queer horror creative and revitalising the slasher genre in its wake. Whilst Don Mancini's Child's Play series ensured that you would never look at toys the same way, it also quietly altered the landscape of horror by having numerous LGBTQIA+ characters within the films, who were not iust there to be slashed, hacked or the 'interesting' best friend.

The same changes were happening within horror literature in the 1990s too. Poppy Z. Brite's gothic novels Lost Souls and Drawing Blood were not only wickedly dark and exciting pieces of horror fiction but were prolific with their use LGBTQIA+ characters, creating three dimensional characters who were positive and open about their sexuality, when most works neglected or didn't even bother to engage with it. Jewelle Gomez provided further exciting LGBTQIA+ characters in their novel The

Gilda Stories, which gave a black LGBTQIA+ perspective on vampirism and immortality, creating a horror work which has helped to largely define numerous ideas of the vampire myth to this day!

Whilst these artists have all provided incredible, game-changing work within the genre, they are sadly rare examples. LGBTQIA+ artists within horror are still few and far-between. Whilst we have seen a positive growth in the number of artists and characters who identify as LGBTQIA+ in many other areas of popular culture, horror is still lacking. This can potentially be put down to a number of issues from years of LGBTQIA+ characters being given a sinister subtext within the genre, being portrayed as 'the other' or sadists, or, as is always the case, a lack of access and support. But hopefully this can start to change.

Horror is one of the most beloved and prolific genres around and with increasing numbers of LGBTQIA+ artists being given opportunities to have their voices heard, surely horror writers and characters will start to positively reflect this change.

Personally as a pansexual artist, I am excited to see the new voices and genre-defining work to come from the queer community and, more importantly, it is only right that if horror is to continue using fantasy and fear to explore the darker reaches of our ever changing world, the characters and voices fighting against the dark should accurately represent all sexualities as a whole.


