




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And a big 'Hello' from all of us here at Hidden Basement Productions!

The UK's biggest festival of live horror performance is back for a fourth year, to thrill and chill audiences for 3 haunting weeks this October.

With more companies than ever bringing their work to the festival, a spectacular launch night extravaganza, a site specific dreamscape experience ("Las Maravillas: The Lost Souls of Mitlan" by The Dreamery), a short film competition complete with celebrity judges AND with Jeremy Dyson and Andy Nyman's 'Ghost Stories' (the most terrifying show in London's West End) and the British Library as our official sponsors - 2014 is looking set to be our most exciting festival yet!

We're kicking off in style at the LOST Theatre in Vauxhall with the return of Stage Fright – our annual writing competition hosted by the acclaimed Wireless Theatre Company. The 2014 competition will be judged by new horror writer Seth Patrick and is not to be missed! Combining with Stage Fright to get the festival started with a bang, we have the London Horror Festival's first ever Horror Cabaret featuring the weird and wonderful talents of some of London's finest burlesque, comedy and vaudeville artists.

The festival is once again back at its official home - the Etcetera Theatre, in the heart of Camden, and the programme couldn't be more exciting! With a mix of horror comedy, Shakespeare, Poe, abstract theatre, psychological drama, ghost stories, and improvisation, there's something for everyone. We have a fantastic mix of brand spanking new theatre companies, established fringe theatre pros and horror festival veterans, all bringing their original work to the stage in 2014 to celebrate the darker side of the performing arts!

And for the first time ever, the festival is branching out to include the screen! This year sees the first annual Horror Shorts competition - a search for the best in original short horror films, with entries judged by non other than horror icons Nicholas Vince, Barbie Wilde and Tim Dry. Films selected by the panel will be shown at an exclusive screening night during the festival where the overall winner will be announced.

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STAGE FRIGHT 2014

The Stage Fright writing competition sets out to find the most frightening and original new short radio dramas from across the world.

The three shortlisted plays will be dramatised by a talented professional team, performed live and recorded by Wireless Theatre Company. These three plays will then be available from both the Wireless Theatre Company and London Horror Festival websites as podcasts, allowing everyone not able to attend the live performance to enjoy each of the short-listed plays.

At the end of the evening, a winning entry will then be selected by our celebrity judge to receive the Andre De Lorde Award for horror writing.

This year's event will be judged by acclaimed horror author Seth Patrick. Seth Patrick is the author of the 'Reviver' trilogy, the first of which was published in June 2013 by Pan Macmillan in the UK and Thomas Dunne Books in the US. Film rights have been optioned by Legendary Pictures, the company behind Inception and Man of Steel.
